- **Towards2030-dialogue** intends to facilitate and guide the RES policy dialogue for the period towards 2030.
- This strategic initiative aims for an intense stakeholder dialogue that establishes a European vision of a joint future RES policy framework.
- Consortium of nine research institutes, lead by Technical University of Vienna
- Other partners: Fraunhofer ISI, ECOFYS, CEPS, NTUA, CSIC, ECN, EUI, REKK

The goal of the Foundation is to contribute to the formation of sustainable energy systems in Central Europe, both from a business and environmental perspective. Its mission statement is to provide a platform for open-ended, European-wide dialogue between government and business actors, infrastructure operators, energy producers and traders, regulators and consumers, professional journalists and other interested private entities. The Foundation will develop policy briefs and issue papers with forward-looking proposals concerning challenges posed by energy and infrastructure systems and organize regional forums allowing stakeholders to become familiar with the latest technological and regulatory developments within the industry. REKK Foundation will realize its goals through the following primary activities:

- Sustain open expert forums to present and discuss Hungarian, regional, European and international energy policy initiatives
- Contribute to knowledge sharing about the regulation of energy and other public utility networks and about the market trends of these sectors, dissemination of applied solutions, educational activities and research

A Central and South East Europe Energy Policy Forum

Regional energy policy forum for policy in English language. Energy policy issues with regional importance are selected for discussion with decision makers from the CEE countries.

Market Monitoring Club

Executive level events on actual issues related to the Hungarian energy markets.

Energy Futures

Professional forum on future technologies and policies, targeting the wider Hungarian professional audience.

REKK Workshop

The leading event of REKK on a specific energy policy issue linked to REKK research with highly qualified international speakers.

REKK essay competition

Opened for university students on predefined energy policy issues.

- 27% community level renewable target
- New RES directive in the pipeline
- Major issues:
 - How to guarantee target compliance in the absence of national targets
 - Role of cooperation
 - Integration of RES policy to the 2030 governance system (integrated planning)
 - Competitiveness of renewables and its implication for support schemes
 - Grid impacts

- How could the Commission motivate MSs to pledge themselves to sufficiently ambitious national RES targets?
- How should the European Commission proceed, if the aggregated national pledges do not reach 27%?
- Are there MS related benchmarks needed for the 2030 RES target achievements? If benchmarks are needed, what should be the followed methodology – flat rate, GDP/capita or RES potential based distribution or other?
- Is there any other suggestions for the methods for closing the gap to the target (if exist)? (e.g. EU wide auctioning of missing RES production?)

- Keynote speech by Jos Delbeke, EC-Director General for Climate Action
- Workshop continues with introductory presentation of project partners on RES governance options and benchmarking for the 2030 target achievement
- Followed by the Member State representatives presentations on national opinions on 2030 target setting from the CSEE region
- Afternoon: roundtable to further elaborate on the regional vision on the 2030 RES targets
